- 5. Clinic volunteers certify that they have errors and omissions insurance, and will agree to maintain errors and omissions insurance at all times during their participation as a clinic volunteer.
- 6. Clinic volunteers may not provide specific legal advice or recommend courses of action to clinic participants.
- 7. Clinic volunteers will use their best efforts to provide at least 18 hours per year of service in the clinic.
- 8. Clinic volunteers will follow all guidelines established for operation of the Bankruptcy Assistance Center.
