**Tentative ruling:**

The Motion requests that upon Westland's payment of the interpleader funds to Bradley Sharp and/or BMO that it be discharged of its obligations under the Settlement Agreement. Various other third parties, including SKF, have made claims to the interpleader funds. SKF objects to the payment of the interpleader funds to Sharp and BMO and asserts that it is improper for the court to determine the parties' respective interests in, and entitlement to, the interpleader funds at this stage of the proceeding. The court agrees with SKF, that at this point it is not proper to determine the various parties' interest in, and entitlement to, the interpleader funds.

Accordingly, the court is inclined to grant the Motion in part and discharge Westland as stakeholder provided the interpleader funds are deposited with the court or held in a segregated account with all of the parties' rights and interests attaching to the proceeds until further order of the court.

The court will hear the matter.
