#### Forms and Legal Advice

Attached to this document are forms and a list of form requirements for a chapter 13 individual case.

You must complete and sign each required document before submitting them to the court. You may need to enter "zero" or "none" in a blank space to fully complete the form.

Federal law prohibits the bankruptcy court from giving any type of legal advice or instruction. If you have a question about how to fill out a form, it is recommended that you contact an attorney.

## **Required Credit Counseling**

Prior to the submission of your bankruptcy case, a Certificate of Credit Counseling must be completed. Only credit counseling organizations that have been approved by the U.S. Trustee Program may issue this certificate. Find an approved credit counseling agency by going to this website: https://www.justice.gov/ust/credit-counseling-debtor-education-information.

## **Filing Fee**

For the current filing fee, see the attached Required Forms for a Chapter 13 Case.

Filing fees from individuals filing without an attorney must be paid in person or by mail with money orders or cashier's checks. All money orders and cashier's checks must be made payable to: Clerk, U.S. Bankruptcy Court. Debit cards are also accepted in person at our Sacramento, Fresno, and Modesto offices. Debtors may use our Online Installment Payment system to pay court approved filing fee installment payments. **No cash accepted**.

Forms to apply to pay the chapter 13 filing fee in installments are available in the attached forms package.

#### **After You File**

Read everything very closely that is sent to you regarding your bankruptcy case.

A *Notice of Chapter 13 Bankruptcy Case* will be mailed to you and the creditors on the mailing list you prepared. This document will list important information such as the trustee assigned to your case, deadlines and the date, time, and location of a hearing called a "Meeting of Creditors." You are required to attend this hearing. At the hearing, the trustee appointed in your case will guestion you about your assets and documents you filed.

If you do not file all documents in your case, you will also receive a *Notice of Incomplete Filing* and *Notice of Intent to Dismiss Case*, which will include a list of documents that you still need to file and the due dates.

You will also receive a Notice of Requirement to File Certification about a Financial Management Course (Official Form 423), along with a form to fill out regarding your instructional course in personal financial management. Failure to take this class and return the form to the court may result in your case being closed without a discharge.

# GUIDELINES FOR PREPARATION OF MASTER ADDRESS LISTS FOR DEBTORS NOT REPRESENTED BY ATTORNEYS<sup>1</sup>

The following guidelines have been approved by the Court and are issued pursuant to Local Bankruptcy Rule 1007-1(b).

A Master Address List includes the names, addresses and zip codes of all creditors in a bankruptcy case. This list is used for noticing and must be filed at the time the petition is filed.

The Court's computer system requires the Master Address List to be prepared for electronic recognition. All Master Address Lists must comply with the following guidelines.

<u>Debtors not represented by an attorney, or whose petitions are prepared by a Bankruptcy Petition Preparer</u>, must prepare the Master Address List using one of the following methods:

- In electronic format when submitting their petition online through the court's Debtor Drop Box program available at <a href="www.debtordropbox.caeb.uscourts.gov">www.debtordropbox.caeb.uscourts.gov</a>. This system will format your address list and electronically produce your required verification.
- In hard copy format, using the court's online application available at
   <u>www.caeb.uscourts.gov/mal/</u>. This guided process will help you complete the address list in
   the correct format and generate the required verification.
- In hard copy format, following the example and requirements below.

# **General Format Requirements**

- Use only plain, 8.5 x 11 white paper.
- Do not print on both sides of the paper.
- Do not use letterhead or include page numbers, line numbers, headers, or footers.
- No handwriting, stray marks, correction fluid or tape.
- Lists should be typed in a single column on the page and prepared in Courier 10 cpi (same as 12 point on a word processor).
- Limit the name and address to 5 lines per creditor.
- Limit each line to 40 characters or less.
- Names of individuals must be in first/middle/last name order. Do not include titles, i.e., Mr., Mrs.
- Creditors must be listed alphabetically, according to the first letter of the company or first name.
- Do not include punctuation in names and addresses, including periods (.) after abbreviations or initials. One comma between the city and state is permitted.
- Do not use <u>any</u> special characters such as %. Hyphens in nine-digit zip codes are permitted.
- "Care of", and "attention" designations may be included only on the second line.
- The city, state and zip code must be on the <u>last</u> line. The name of the state must be abbreviated using two upper case letters. Zip codes are mandatory.
- Foreign addresses must include the <u>complete</u> name of the country.
- Leave at least two blank lines between one creditor's name and address and another's. Do not leave blank lines within an address, or between a creditor's name and address.
- Do not duplicate creditors with the same address, even if there is more than one account with that creditor. Do not include account numbers in the list of creditors.
- Do not include the debtor, joint debtor, attorney for the debtor(s), or United States Trustee on the list.
- When the Unites States is a creditor on a debt for other than taxes, it must be listed on Master Address
  Lists in accordance with Local Bankruptcy Rule 2002-1(a). Other federal and state agencies that have
  specified particular addresses to which notice of bankruptcy proceeding must be listed on Master
  Address Lists using the addressed shown on form EDC 2-785, Roster of Governmental Agencies.
- Every Master Address List must be accompanied by a Verification of Master Address List, form EDC 2-100.

If you are represented by an attorney, you do not need to file this page. The law allows you, as an individual, to represent yourself in bankruptcy court, but you should understand that many people find it extremely difficult to represent themselves successfully. Because bankruptcy has long-term financial and legal consequences, you are strongly urged to hire a qualified attorney.

To be successful, you must correctly file and handle your bankruptcy case. The rules are very technical, and a mistake or inaction may affect your rights. For example, your case may be dismissed because you did not file a required document, pay a fee on time, attend a meeting or hearing, or cooperate with the court, case trustee, U.S. trustee, bankruptcy administrator, or audit firm if your case is selected for audit. If that happens, you could lose your right to file another case, or you may lose protections, including the benefit of the automatic stay.

You must list all your property and debts in the schedules that you are required to file with the court. Even if you plan to pay a particular debt outside of your bankruptcy, you must list that debt in your schedules. If you do not list a debt, the debt may not be discharged. If you do not list property or properly claim it as exempt, you may not be able to keep the property. The judge can also deny you a discharge of all your debts if you do something dishonest in your bankruptcy case, such as destroying or hiding property, falsifying records, or lying. Individual bankruptcy cases are randomly audited to determine if debtors have been accurate, truthful, and complete. Bankruptcy fraud is a serious crime; you could be fined and imprisoned.

If you decide to file without an attorney, the court expects you to follow the rules as if you had hired an attorney. The court will not treat you differently because you are filing for yourself. To be successful, you must be familiar with the United States Bankruptcy Code, the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure, and the local rules of the court in which your case is filed. You must also be familiar with any state exemption laws that apply.

- 3.08. Class 2 includes all secured claims that are modified by this plan, or that have matured or will mature before the plan is completed.
  - (a) Payment of claim. Subject to section 3.08(c), the "monthly dividend" payable to each Class 2A and 2B claim is an equal monthly payment sufficient to pay each claim in full with interest at the rate specified below. If no interest rate is specified, a 5% rate will be imputed.
  - **(b) Adequate protection payments.** Prior to confirmation, Trustee shall pay on account of each Class 2(A) and 2(B) claim secured by a purchase money security interest in personal property an adequate protection payment if required by section 1326(a)(1)(C). The adequate protection payment shall equal the monthly dividend. Debtor is prohibited from reducing a claim if the claim holder has a purchase money security interest and the claim either was incurred within 910 days of the filing of the case and is secured by a motor vehicle acquired for the personal use of Debtor, or was incurred within 1-year of the filing of the case and is secured by any other thing of value. These claims must be included in Class 2(A).
    - (2) Class 2 claims that may be reduced based on the value of their collateral shall be included in Class 2(B) or 2(C) as is appropriate.
    - (3) Class 2 claims secured by Debtor's principal residence. Except as permitted by 11 U.S.C. § 1322(c), Debtor is prohibited from modifying the rights of a holder of a claim secured only by Debtor's principal residence.
  - (d) Lien retention. Each Class 2 creditor shall retain its existing lien until completion of the plan and, unless not required by Bankruptcy Court, entry of Debtor's discharge.

#### 3.11. Bankruptcy stays.

- (a) Upon confirmation of the plan, the automatic stay of 11 U.S.C. § 362(a) and the co-debtor stay of 11 U.S.C. § 1301(a) are (1) terminated to allow the holder of a Class 3 secured claim to exercise its rights against its collateral; (2) modified to allow the holder of a Class 4 secured claim to exercise its rights against its collateral and any nondebtor in the event of a default under applicable law or contract; and (3) modified to allow the nondebtor party to an unexpired lease that is in default and rejected in section 4 of this plan to obtain possession of leased property, to dispose of it under applicable law, and to exercise its rights against any nondebtor.
- (b) Secured claims not listed as Class 1, 2, 3, or 4 claims are not provided for by this plan. While this may be cause to terminate the automatic stay, such relief must be separately requested by the claim holder.
- (c) If, after confirmation of the plan, the court grants a motion to terminate the automatic stay to permit a Class 1 EDC 3-080 (rev. 11/9/18)

or 2 claim holder to proceed against its collateral, unless the court orders otherwise, Trustee shall make no further payments on account of such claim and any portion of such claim not previously satisfied under this plan shall be satisfied as a Class 3 claim. Trustee shall pay the monthly dividend specified in the table below on account of those arrears.

### Section 5. Payment of Claims and Order of Distribution

- **5.01.** After confirmation, payments by Trustee to holders of allowed claims and approved expenses will be made monthly.
- 5.02. Distribution of plan payment.
  - (a) At a minimum, each monthly plan payment must be sufficient to pay in full: (i) Trustee's fees; (ii) post-petition monthly payments due on Class 1 claims; (iii) the monthly dividend specified in section 3.06 for administrative expenses; and (iv) the monthly dividends payable on account of Class 1 arrearage claims, Class 2 claims, and executory contract and unexpired lease arrearage claims.
  - (b) If the amount paid by Debtor is insufficient to pay all of the minimum dividends required by section 5.02(a), Trustee shall pay, to the extent possible, such fees, payments, expenses, and claims in the order specified in section 5.02(a)(i) through (iv). If the amount paid by Debtor is insufficient to pay all dividends due on account of fees, payments, expenses, and claims within a subpart of section 5.02(a), no dividend shall be paid on account of any of the fees, payments, expenses, and claims within such subpart except as permitted by section 3.07(b)(3).

- (c) Each month, if funds remain after payment of all monthly dividends due on account of the fees, payments, expenses, and claims specified in section 5.02(a)(i) through (iv), the remainder shall be paid pro rata, first to holders of Class 1 arrearage claims, Class 2 claims, and executory contract and unexpired lease arrearage claims; second to Class 5 priority claims; third to Class 6 unsecured claims; and fourth to Class 7 unsecured claims.
- (d) Over the plan's duration, distributions must equal the total dividends required by sections 3.04, 3.06, 3.07, 3.08, 3.12, 3.13, 3.14, and 4.01. The case may be dismissed if Debtor's plan payments are or will be insufficient to pay these dividends.
- **5.03. Priority of payment among administrative expenses.** The portion of the monthly plan payment allocated in section 3.06 for administrative expenses, shall be distributed first to any former chapter 7 trustee up to the monthly amount required by 11 U.S.C. § 1326(b)(3)B), and second to holders of approved administrative expenses on a pro rata basis.

### Section 6. Miscellaneous Provisions

Debtor's duties.** In addition to the duties imposed upon Debtor by the Bankruptcy Code, the Bankruptcy Rules, and applicable nonbankruptcy law, the court's Local Bankruptcy Rules impose additional duties on Debtor, including without limitation, obtaining prior court authorization prior to transferring property or incurring additional debt, maintaining insurance, providing Trustee copies of tax returns, W-2 forms, 1099 forms, and quarterly financial information regarding Debtor's business or financial affairs, and providing Trustee not later than the 14 days after the filing of the case with the Domestic Support Obligation Checklist for each domestic support obligation and a Class 1 Checklist and Authorization to Release Information for each Class 1 claim.
- **6.03. Post-Petition claims.** If a proof of claim is filed and allowed for a claim of the type described in 11 U.S.C. § 1305(a), this plan may be modified to provide for such claim.
- **6.04.** Remedies upon default. If Debtor defaults under this plan, or if the plan will not be completed within six months of its stated term, not to exceed 60 months, Trustee or any other party in interest may request appropriate relief by filing a motion and setting it for hearing pursuant to Local Bankruptcy Rule 9014-1. This relief may consist of, without limitation, dismissal of the case, conversion of the case to chapter 7, or relief from the automatic stay to pursue rights against collateral.

### Section 7. Nonstandard Provisions

Debtor may propose nonstandard provisions that modify the preprinted text of this form plan. All nonstandard plan provisions shall be on a separate piece of paper appended to this plan. Each nonstandard provision shall be identified by a section number beginning with section 7.01 and indicate which section(s) of the form plan are modified by the nonstandard provision. Nonstandard provisions placed elsewhere are void. # Notice Required by 11 U.S.C. § 342(b) for Individuals Filing for Bankruptcy (Form 2010)

### This notice is for you if:

You are an individual filing for bankruptcy, and

Your debts are primarily consumer debts.

Consumer debts are defined in 11 U.S.C. § 101(8) as "incurred by an individual primarily for a personal, family, or household purpose."

## The types of bankruptcy that are available to individuals

Individuals who meet the qualifications may file under one of four different chapters of the Bankruptcy Code:

- Chapter 7 Liquidation
- Chapter 11— Reorganization
- Chapter 12— Voluntary repayment plan for family farmers or fishermen
- Chapter 13— Voluntary repayment plan for individuals with regular income

You should have an attorney review your decision to file for bankruptcy and the choice of chapter.

### Chapter 7: Liquidation

Chapter 7 is for individuals who have financial difficulty preventing them from paying their debts and who are willing to allow their non-exempt property to be used to pay their creditors. The primary purpose of filing under chapter 7 is to have your debts discharged. The bankruptcy discharge relieves you after bankruptcy from having to pay many of your pre-bankruptcy debts. Exceptions exist for particular debts, and liens on property may still be enforced after discharge. For example, a creditor may have the right to foreclose a home mortgage or repossess an automobile.

However, if the court finds that you have committed certain kinds of improper conduct described in the Bankruptcy Code, the court may deny your discharge.

You should know that even if you file chapter 7 and you receive a discharge, some debts are not discharged under the law.

Therefore, you may still be responsible to pay:

- most taxes;
- most student loans;
- domestic support and property settlement obligations;

- most fines, penalties, forfeitures, and criminal restitution obligations; and
- certain debts that are not listed in your bankruptcy papers.

You may also be required to pay debts arising from:

- fraud or theft;
- fraud or defalcation while acting in breach of fiduciary capacity;
- intentional injuries that you inflicted; and
- death or personal injury caused by operating a motor vehicle, vessel, or aircraft while intoxicated from alcohol or drugs.

If your debts are primarily consumer debts, the court can dismiss your chapter 7 case if it finds that you have enough income to repay creditors a certain amount. You must file *Chapter 7 Statement of Your Current Monthly Income* (Official Form 122A–1) if you are an individual filing for bankruptcy under chapter 7. This form will determine your current monthly income and compare whether your income is more than the median income that applies in your state.

If your income is not above the median for your state, you will not have to complete the other chapter 7 form, the *Chapter 7 Means Test Calculation* (Official Form 122A–2).

If your income is above the median for your state, you must file a second form —the *Chapter 7 Means Test Calculation* (Official Form 122A–2). The calculations on the form—sometimes called the *Means Test*—deduct from your income living expenses and payments on certain debts to determine any amount available to pay unsecured creditors. If

your income is more than the median income for your state of residence and family size, depending on the results of the *Means Test*, the U.S. trustee, bankruptcy administrator, or creditors can file a motion to dismiss your case under § 707(b) of the Bankruptcy Code. If a motion is filed, the court will decide if your case should be dismissed. To avoid dismissal, you may choose to proceed under another chapter of the Bankruptcy Code.

If you are an individual filing for chapter 7 bankruptcy, the trustee may sell your property to pay your debts, subject to your right to exempt the property or a portion of the proceeds from the sale of the property. The property, and the proceeds from property that your bankruptcy trustee sells or liquidates that you are entitled to, is called *exempt property*. Exemptions may enable you to keep your home, a car, clothing, and household items or to receive some of the proceeds if the property is sold.

Exemptions are not automatic. To exempt property, you must list it on *Schedule C: The Property You Claim as Exempt* (Official Form 106C). If you do not list the property, the trustee may sell it and pay all of the proceeds to your creditors.

### **Chapter 11: Reorganization**

Chapter 11 is often used for reorganizing a business, but is also available to individuals. The provisions of chapter 11 are too complicated to summarize briefly.

### **Read These Important Warnings**

Because bankruptcy can have serious long-term financial and legal consequences, including loss of your property, you should hire an attorney and carefully consider all of your options before you file. Only an attorney can give you legal advice about what can happen as a result of filing for bankruptcy and what your options are. If you do file for bankruptcy, an attorney can help you fill out the forms properly and protect you, your family, your home, and your possessions.

Although the law allows you to represent yourself in bankruptcy court, you should understand that many people find it difficult to represent themselves successfully. The rules are technical, and a mistake or inaction may harm you. If you file without an attorney, you are still responsible for knowing and following all of the legal requirements.

You should not file for bankruptcy if you are not eligible to file or if you do not intend to file the necessary documents.

Bankruptcy fraud is a serious crime; you could be fined and imprisoned if you commit fraud in your bankruptcy case. Making a false statement, concealing property, or obtaining money or property by fraud in connection with a bankruptcy case can result in fines up to \$250,000, or imprisonment for up to 20 years, or both. 18 U.S.C. §§ 152, 1341, 1519, and 3571.

### Chapter 12: Repayment plan for family farmers or fishermen

Similar to chapter 13, chapter 12 permits family farmers and fishermen to repay their debts over a period of time using future earnings and to discharge some debts that are not paid.

# Chapter 13: Repayment plan for individuals with regular income

Chapter 13 is for individuals who have regular income and would like to pay all or part of their debts in installments over a period of time and to discharge some debts that are not paid. You are eligible for chapter 13 only if your debts are not more than certain dollar amounts set forth in 11 U.S.C. § 109.

Under chapter 13, you must file with the court a plan to repay your creditors all or part of the money that you owe them, usually using your future earnings. If the court approves your plan, the court will allow you to repay your debts, as adjusted by the plan, within 3 years or 5 years, depending on your income and other factors.

After you make all the payments under your plan, many of your debts are discharged. The debts that are not discharged and that you may still be responsible to pay include:

- domestic support obligations,
- most student loans,
- certain taxes.
- debts for fraud or theft,
- debts for fraud or defalcation while acting in a fiduciary capacity,
- most criminal fines and restitution obligations,
- certain debts that are not listed in your bankruptcy papers,
- certain debts for acts that caused death or personal injury, and
- certain long-term secured debts.

### **Warning: File Your Forms on Time**

Section 521(a)(1) of the Bankruptcy Code requires that you promptly file detailed information about your creditors, assets, liabilities, income, expenses and general financial condition. The court may dismiss your bankruptcy case if you do not file this information within the deadlines set by the Bankruptcy Code, the Bankruptcy Rules, and the local rules of the court.

# Bankruptcy crimes have serious consequences

- If you knowingly and fraudulently conceal assets or make a false oath or statement under penalty of perjury—either orally or in writing—in connection with a bankruptcy case, you may be fined, imprisoned, or both.
- All information you supply in connection with a bankruptcy case is subject to examination by the Attorney General acting through the Office of the U.S. Trustee, the Office of the U.S. Attorney, and other offices and employees of the U.S. Department of Justice.

# Make sure the court has your mailing address

The bankruptcy court sends notices to the mailing address you list on *Voluntary Petition* for *Individuals Filing for Bankruptcy* (Official Form 101). To ensure that you receive information about your case, Bankruptcy Rule 4002 requires that you notify the court of any changes in your address.

A married couple may file a bankruptcy case together—called a *joint case*. If you file a joint case and each spouse lists the same mailing address on the bankruptcy petition, the bankruptcy court generally will mail you and your spouse one copy of each notice, unless you file a statement with the court asking that each spouse receive separate copies.

# Understand which services you could receive from credit counseling agencies

The law generally requires that you receive a credit counseling briefing from an approved credit counseling agency. 11 U.S.C. § 109(h). If you are filing a joint case, both spouses must receive the briefing. With limited exceptions, you must receive it within the 180 days **before** you file your bankruptcy petition. This briefing is usually conducted by telephone or on the Internet.

In addition, after filing a bankruptcy case, you generally must complete a financial management instructional course before you can receive a discharge. If you are filing a joint case, both spouses must complete the course.

If you do not have access to a computer, the clerk of the bankruptcy court may be able to help you obtain the list.
